Lancashire Primary Schools Fairtrade Conference

Last Friday, a small group of Years 5 and 6 Fairtrade Warriors were invited to attend the Lancashire Primary Schools Fairtrade Conference held at County Hall.

The children took part in three workshops: "All About Tea and the Fairtrade Premium" which discussed climate change and how villages work collaboratively to purchase vital resources; "All About Footballs" where the children learnt how footballs are made, as well as taking part in a design a football competition. Then lastly, the children undertook the "All About Chocolate" workshop, which taught them about the process of how Fairtrade chocolate is made, from removing the beans from cocoa pods, to roasting, then mixing with cocoa butter to make chocolate bars. Towards the end of the day, our FTWs delivered a short presentation to other schools, celebrating our success at achieving the FairAchiever Schools Award. The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and even came away with a goody bag!



Reception and Years 1 and 2 disco - 5.00pm - 6.00pm


Drop off for Reception and Years 1 and 2 children will be through the hall door by the car park and pick up will be from the KS2 playground.
