Reception Trip to Smithills Farm

This week our Reception children had a wonderful visit to Smithills Farm. On arrival, the children were greeted by the view of a huge cowshed full of different types of cows before they set off on a bumpy tractor ride and met the greedy donkeys who came up to the side of the cart for the children to feed them bread. The children were also very lucky to have the opportunity to ride a donkey, which many said was the best part of the day.

The children explored the farm seeing various animals that you would not normally find at a farm, such as snakes, lemurs, skinks, meerkats, skunks, and a big tarantula! There was even a tortoise sunbathing in a pool! The children watched an amazing show and met baby lambs, geese, pygmy goats, and emus. The baby emus were especially mischievous as they ran round for a second lap, much to everyone's delight. A cute moment was when the children held the rabbits and chicks, who were just as cheeky as the emus. One of the highlights of the visit was watching milking time and the children were fascinated to see the milk go into the tank and bottled ready for delivery.

Our Reception children had the most amazing time at Smithills Farm.

KS1 Trip to Cobble Hey Farm

This week, KS1 enjoyed fantastic days out at Cobble Hey Farm, full of fun, learning, and fresh countryside air!

The day began with a hands-on experience meeting the animals. The children had the opportunity to feed the goats and chickens, and they especially loved holding the baby goats and rabbits – there were lots of smiles and gentle cuddles!

Later, the children became little chefs as they made their own pizzas for lunch. This activity tied in perfectly with a mini lesson about where our food comes from and how it gets to our plates, helping the children understand the journey from farm to fork.

After lunch, the children went on a lovely walk through the fields. The weather was kind, and they were lucky enough to spot Blackpool Tower in the distance! The walk gave the children a chance to appreciate the beauty of the countryside and enjoy the wide-open space.

The children also explored the farm's gardens, where they discovered bee hives and butterfly homes. The children were fascinated by the important jobs bees and butterflies do for our environment. There was even time for a bit of tree hugging, encouraging everyone to connect with nature.

It was a day full of adventure – a wonderful way to support our learning about animals, food, and nature.

Plea for unwanted toys


The Reception Team are looking for donations of the following unwanted, good condition, toys for the EYFS classroom.
