"Jesus, remember me."

'Those words from the thief on the cross echo a cry that arises deep within each one of us. We all know what it is like to be remembered. It brings us some sense of life, healing and wholeness. We feel that we matter, we belong, we exist and our life is real.' [1]

'Re-member can be used to mean 'put back together again.' When we are re-membered it is as if our life is being put back together; we are being made whole. Our cry to be remembered is a recognition and confession of our dis-memberment when pieces of our lives have been scattered and lost. It happens through the circumstances of lives: loss and grief, shattered dreams, regret, disappointment, failures, the death of a loved one. Sometimes it comes about through our actions, our words, even our thoughts. Our life becomes fragmented and broken. When that happens we can easily dis-member the lives of others in an attempt to put our own back together.' [1]

'Paradise is the state of being re-membered. It is what Jesus offers us and what we, in our remembering and living like Jesus, offer each other. Re-membering is neither about the past nor the future; it is about today. It is Jesus' presence with us, and ours with him and each other, here, now, in whatever our life circumstances might be. Re-membering is always an act of love. Every time we participate in the life of Christ by living with mercy, compassion, forgiveness; every time we speak a word of hope and encouragement; every time we love without condition, expectation or payment; every time we share our bread and live in communion with one another, we participate in Christ's re-membering of our own lives, the lives of each other, and the life of Creation. We "do this in remembrance of Jesus." In those moments we hear His promise, "Today you are with me in paradise."" [1]

Today's second reading reminds us that in Christ "all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible; in him all things hold together." [2] 'When we experience the universe as Christ-soaked, when we know that the universe is both the hiding place and the revelation of God, when we grow in awareness that in Christ all things were made, our lives will reflect our oneness with everything.' [3] We will be with Christ in paradise – every day.
